

## GRACE PERIOD VOTING

Individuals that have not registered prior to the close of registration (March 9, 2021) and wish to vote in the April 6, 2021 Consolidated Election may register to vote and cast a ballot during the Grace Period Voting.

For the April Consolidated Election, Grace Period voting will begin March 10, 2021. Grace voting will be conducted at the Election Department (temporary polling location, first floor) of the Old Lee County Courthouse, Monday through Friday, 8:15 a.m. until 4:15 p.m.; Saturday, April 3, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.; and Election Day, 6:00 a.m. until 7 p.m.

PLEASE NOTE: Lee County Courthouse will be closed  
Friday, April 2, 2021

Persons registering and voting during the grace period must be a US citizen, must be 18 years of age by election day, must claim Lee County as their permanent residence and have resided within their precinct 30 days preceding the election; and must display a current driver's license, a state-issued ID card or two other forms of identification verifying their current address within Lee County.

The law prohibits a person who voted during the Grace Period from voting at the polls on Election Day. The votes cast during the grace voting time period will not be counted until Election Day.
